## Arrangements for exams

### During the exam period:

Read the **exam timetable** carefully and ensure you arrive promptly for all exams.



**Morning exams:** Come straight to the Hall for registration. Some exams are quite long and we want to make sure we're finished by break so please be prompt! Please be aware that if you arrive late you will not be allocated any extra time.

### Exams after break:

11:20 exams. Stay in the hall after break and get ready to be called in.

Again, we don't want to delay your lunch, so please be on time!

When you do not have an exam **attend lessons** as normal. Normal school **uniform and rules** apply.

**Bags** must be left on the stage before entering the exam room. **Pencil cases** are not allowed so you should carry your stationery in your hand. Please make sure you are fully prepared for exams with **black pens** and other required items as advised by your teachers.

You must not bring a **mobile phone** into the exam room. Secure storage will be available. All **wristwatches** also need to be removed and placed in secure storage.



You may bring a bottle of **water** into the exam but **all labels must be removed** from bottles. Only clear water is allowed – no squash or fizzy drinks. Chewing-gum will not be allowed.

Impeccable **behaviour** is essential in these exams. You must not talk or attempt to communicate with other students in any way once you are in the exam room. If you have any questions you must raise your hand and wait for an **invigilator**.

These mocks provide a realistic practice for the actual examination. They are an opportunity for you to **find out what to expect**. They also help you and your teachers to **identify any gaps in your understanding** so that we can give you as much support as possible before the real exams in the summer.

Full exam board conditions will apply during the exam period and every effort will be made to provide you with the best opportunities to perform to the highest standard of which you are capable.

A copy of the **exam timetable** can be found in this booklet. This gives times, duration and location of your exams as well as extra information where appropriate. When not in an examination you will attend normal lessons.

No-one needs to tell you that the quality and quantity of revision you do will directly affect your results. A **revision timetable** for the holiday period is included in this booklet and blank revision timetables will be available from your tutors for planning your revision before and during the exam weeks. Please read the information on the timetable carefully and make sure you remember the importance of rest, fun and your health when thinking about your plans. No-one wants you to be stressed-out and you will not perform to your best standard if you are unhappy.

## Mock exam revision timetable – Christmas holiday

This may help you to plan ahead and structure your revision. Make a plan which includes all of the subjects you will be examined in. You are not expected to revise every day during the holiday (you definitely should not!) but a sensible plan which leaves plenty of time for festive fun will help you to come back relaxed about the exams. Choose the days and times which suit you best.

**Tips:** Remember to take regular breaks during your revision (20 minutes on, followed by a 10 minute break works well).

Make mind-maps/ posters / revision cards. This will ensure your revision is active and productive. Keep them safe and you will be able to re-use them for the summer exams.  
Complete past papers – doing something to try to actively retrieve the information helps it to stay in your memory.

Do something to keep your brain / body active during your break (walk the dog, phone a friend, chat to a parent, play a game of cards etc. Don't watch TV or use electronic devices which allow you to be passive and may tempt you to delay getting back to work).

Factor in mealtimes, sleep time and time for relaxing. If you are not well rested, well-nourished and happy you will not achieve your best.
